Dear Friends.

God is good!

Thank you all for supporting my March trip to Korea with your prayers! He continues to go before me and clearly to guide this whole endeavor.

On my way to Korea, I stopped off in Tokyo and met with Professor Lee, Dae Sung, Deputy Director of the Institute for Contemporary Korean Studies at Waseda University. He was very interested in our vision for North Korea and confirmed its importance. I look forward to working with him and, through him, developing contacts in Japan. My cousin, Arlo Johnson, who lives in Tokyo provided a place to stay and took me around for which I am most grateful!

The time in Korea was the busiest yet. In addition to a number of meetings with various individuals, we also prepared for our first trustees meeting since the original trustees for the Three Seas Center met with my father several years ago. In addition to those who were involved then, we have added a number of people who have a lot to contribute to our work. Our meeting on Saturday, March 20th was more successful than we had hoped. My mother, Jane Torrey, as the Chair of the Jesus Abbey trustees (under whose authority we are operating) opened the meeting with prayer and appreciation to all for participating. By the end of the meeting, we had a finance committee who are shouldering the great task of raising the funds we need to carry us through the purchase of the land this fall--a total of about \$800,000 to cover land purchase, final payments on all the engineering and architectural work and operating expenses. We also had a committee beginning preparations for a series of lectures on North Korea, the first of which we plan to put on at Jesus Abbey in July. Others will follow at various sites around the country. This is to actually begin the work of preparing Christians for the opening of North Korea by imparting important knowledge concerning the land, its people, culture, history and government. Please keep both of these efforts in your prayers.

I will be spending two to three weeks in Korea about every other month for the rest of this year. Please keep me in your prayers for this and especially for my wife, Liz, and daughter, Joanna. They have to take up the slack when I am not home. Praise the Lord! He has called both Liz and me to this work and we share the vision. If this were not so, I could never do it. As it is, her support is vital.

Central Connecticut Prayer Rally for North Korea

It is from 7:00pm to 8:30pm at Trinity Covenant Church, 302 Hackmatack St., Manchester, CT. We are excited to have Prof. Kim, Hyun Sik speak at the rally. Professor Kim is currently a visiting professor at Yale University where he lectures on North Korea. He and his wife are refugees from the North. I am deeply grateful for the participation and support of both lay people and clergy from a number of churches in this area--Korean and non-Korean. We anticipate a few hundred in attendance and from this, the launching of North Korea prayer groups and prayer times. The theme is taken from Isaiah 62: 6-7, "Give Him no rest!" If you are anywhere nearby on that day, please come! I hope to follow this rally up with others in southern Connecticut, Massachusetts and elsewhere as we expand the North Korea prayer network--the strong vision of Pastor David of NK Missions (www.nkmissions.com).

Trip to Southern California

As I mentioned in my last newsletter, I am going to be in Los Angeles from April 22 to 28 to attend the "No Limits" conference.

OMF International and NK Missions are collaborating to present "No Limits" New Frontiers in East Asia in Fullerton, CA. This conference begins with a prayer rally for North Korea on Friday the 23rd from 7:30 to 9:30 in the evening. On Saturday, Dr. David Harley, OMF General Director will speak. Following the conference on Sunday, I have speaking engagements at the Onnuri Church and Journey Fellowship. On Monday, I will be participating in a meeting of church, university and mission leaders to exploring strategic ways of collaborating for ministry in and for North Korea. My hope and prayer is that this will be only the beginning of a new level of cooperation among the many organizations that God has called as instruments of His love for North Korea. At the present there are humanitarian, human rights, educational and evangelistic organizations all focusing on North Korea. Unfortunately, we are not all collaborating as we could be to strengthen

and support one another. God has called us to do different aspects of the great work that He has in mind. All to often, I feel, we get so focused on the piece of the picture that has been given to us that we look on our brothers and sisters who have a different piece as competitors or, worse, pursuing the wrong strategy. Pray for unity, not only in the Church of Jesus Christ, but also among all who labor out of love for North Korea and its suffering people. The Lord is bigger than all of us together. All our works fit together in His great plan.
